Ethiopian Receives its 11th B787, Fit with Full-Flat Business Class Seat and Latest Generation In-Flight Entertainment



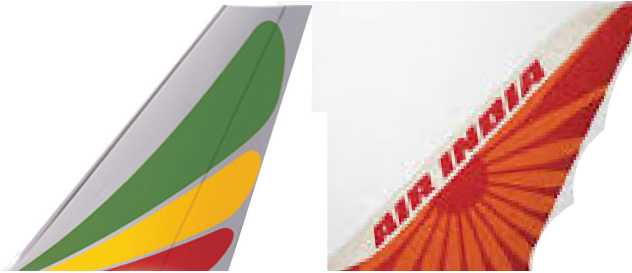
Ethiopian Airlines will be welcoming the 11th B787 Dreamliner at its main hub Addis Ababa Bole International Airport on January 31, 2015.

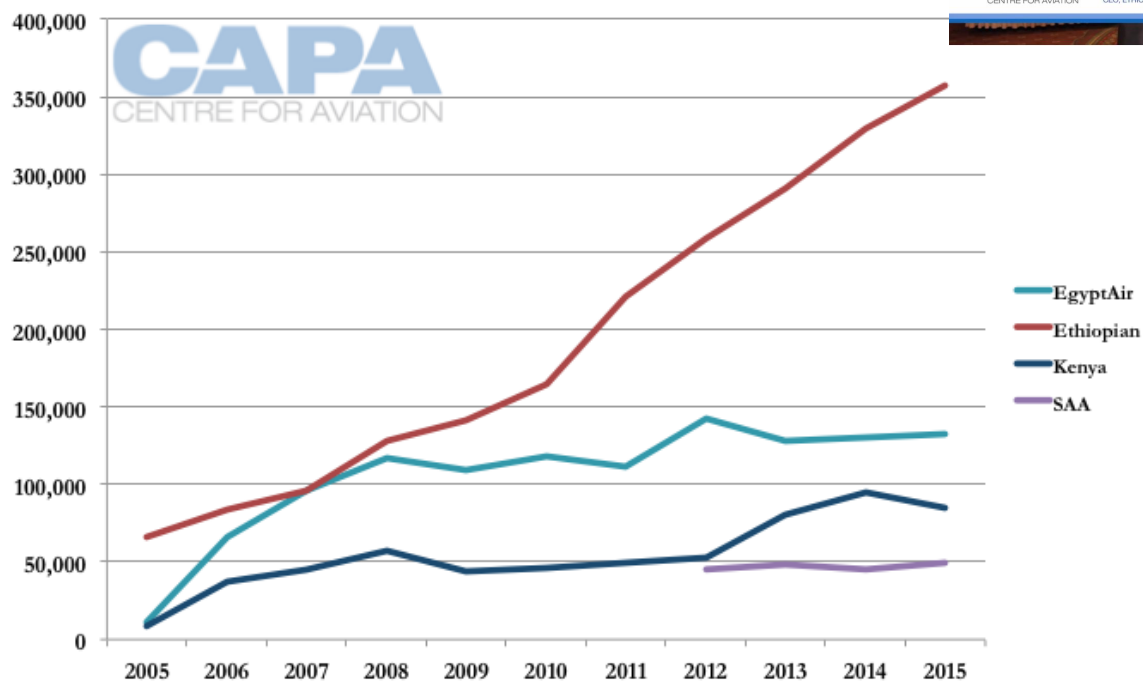

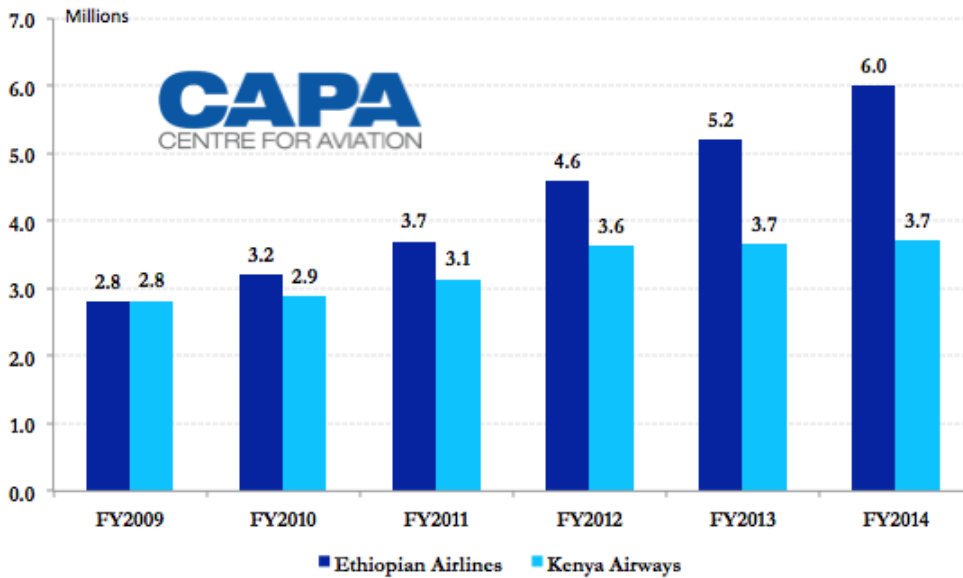

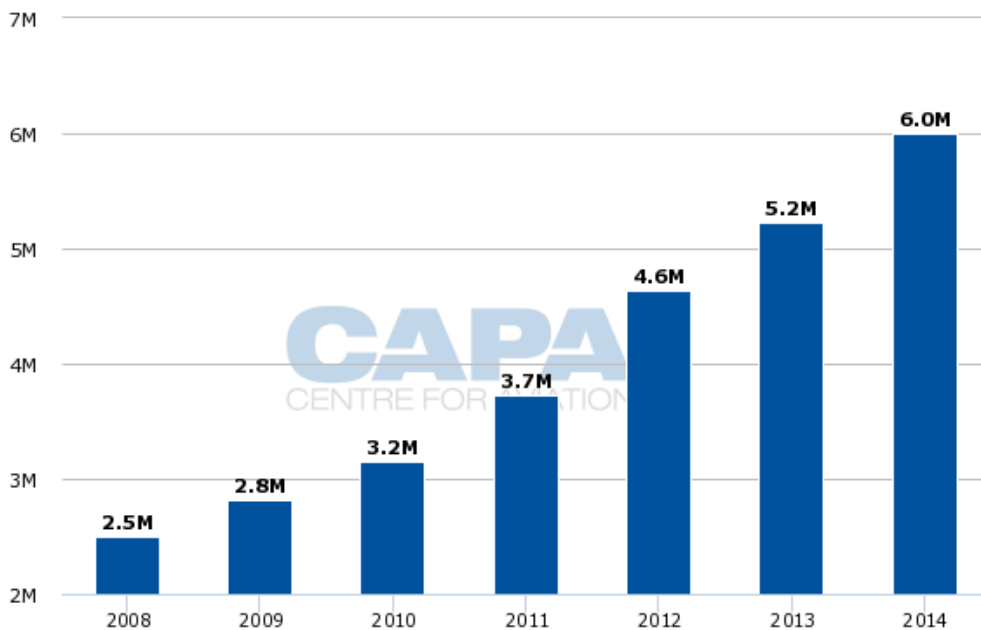
